

Call for Entry

The Center for Liturgical Art (CLA) is seeking qualified applicants to apply for their Fellowship program. The Fellowship program will be offered during the summer of 2018 and is open to recent graduates seeking to advance their abilities as liturgical artists. The selected Fellow will spend approximately four hours each weekday under the assistance and guidance of CLA staff working on a project the Fellow have proposed and for which the Fellow has secured funding. An additional four hours each day will be spent working on CLA projects in order to gain a wider range of experience and technical skills. The position includes full time pay and housing for the duration of the project.

Qualified candidates will exemplify the following:

- A strong understanding of theological principles and their impact on aesthetics
- A prolific body of artist accomplishments
- A self-starter with a teachable disposition
- A desire to serve the Church

Through this position the fellow is expected to:

- Successfully complete their first major commission;
- Receive full time pay and housing for the duration of the project;
- Be allowed studio space for personal development;
- Build lasting network connections; and
- Gain valuable experience while utilizing and honing skills learned in their undergraduate studies and by developing new skills learned from artists at The CLA.

Individuals interested in applying for the Fellowship are encouraged to gather and submit the following documents:

- Personal Résumé
- Bio/Artist Statement
- Letter of Intent
- Letter of Recommendation from an appropriate individual with credentials in the Arts and/or the Church.
- Project Proposal project proposals should detail the commission the applicant seeks to undertake, the assent of the commissioning body, a rough timeline of completion, and an estimate of material costs to be covered by the commissioning body.
